The November 20-22, 2013 meeting of the North Carolina Medical Board was held at the Board's Office, 1203 Front Street, Raleigh, NC 27609. Paul S. Camnitz, MD, President, called the meeting to order. Presidential Remarks

Dr. Camnitz commenced the meeting by reminding the Board members of their duty to avoid conflicts of interest with respect to any matters coming before the Board as required by the State Government Ethics Act. No conflicts were reported.

The next step in the property search is to identify the top three properties and engage an architectural firm to perform site studies on these to evaluate building options and feasibility for each property.

Mr. John Kerr, York Properties, has been selected to assist the Board with its sale or lease of the current office location. Mr. Kerr met with the Committee to discuss his efforts in this regard. The next step is to enter into a listing agreement to formally engage Mr. Kerr and York Properties.

b) Task Tracker

The Committee reviewed outstanding items on the Task Tracker report.

a) NCMB Bylaws

The Board is undergoing a review of its Bylaws. Proposed changes are below.

b) Trustee Appointment

The NC Medical Board offers two deferred compensation plans to its employees: a 401(k) retirement plan and a 457(b) retirement plan. The Committee reviewed resolutions which would add April Pearce, NCMB Comptroller, as an additional trustee to these plans.

Committee Recommendation: Approve adding April Pearce as an additional trustee to the NCMB retirement plans.

Board Action: The Board accepted the Committee recommendation.

c) FTC v. Board of Dental Examiners

Earlier this year, the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals affirmed a FTC ruling that the Board of Dental Examiners (BODE) was subject to federal antitrust laws and that it engaged in anti-competitive activity by sending cease and desist letters to teeth-whitening companies. The BODE has asked the US Supreme Court to review the Fourth Circuit's opinion. The NC Attorney General (AG) has decided to file an amicus brief in support of the BODE's petition. Various NC occupational licensing boards (OLBs) might be asked to sign on as a party to the AG's brief. Also, various OLBs have been asked to help with the cost of preparing the brief (which will be prepared by a private law firm).

Committee Recommendation: Approve NCMB signing on as a party to the AG's brief (subject to approval of NCMB attorneys) and contributing \$2,500 to the cost of preparing the brief.

Board Action: The Board accepted the Committee recommendation.

d) FSMB Resolution – Collateral Consequences Roundtable

On June 19, 2013, the Board held a Collateral Consequences Roundtable with numerous interested parties to discuss the consequences of public board actions relating to board certification, hospital privileging, employment, medical liability coverage, inclusion on insurance panels, and membership in professional societies. Ultimately, the Board produced a report which is posted on the Board's website and which includes several recommendations - including submitting a resolution to the 2014 Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) House of Delegates. Staff submitted a proposed resolution for the Committee's review.

Committee Recommendation: Submit the proposed resolution to the 2014 FSMB House of Delegates.

Board Action: The Board accepted the Committee recommendation.

e) NCMB Review Panel Appointment

The NCMB Review Panel was established to review candidates for positions on the Board and make recommendations to the Governor. The Review Panel consists of nine members including a public member of the Board. Ms. Thelma C. Lennon currently serves as the Board's representative on the Review Panel and is eligible for reappointment.

Committee Recommendation: Reappoint Ms. Thelma C. Lennon to serve as the Board's representative on the Review Panel for 2014.

It was also noted that federal legislation is beginning to blur the jurisdictional boundaries regarding licensure requirements as they apply to telemedicine.

Public Affairs recommends that the NCMB discontinue this report in its current form and produce a new report that provides a more full account of the Board's work in a given year (some financials, licensing activity, complaint and investigations activity, plus public actions).

Committee Recommendation: Approve Public Affairs department recommendation to replace the existing Board Actions Report with a broader Annual Report that includes detailed licensee demographics, an executive summary of the Board activities for the year, information on public and private Board actions and other information that highlights Board activities for the year.

Board Action: Accept Committee recommendation

a. SESSION LAW 2013-23 (911 Good Samaritan/Nalaxone Access Law)

Discuss whether to publicize/ ways to publicize Session Law 2013-23, which provides limited immunity for certain drug-related offenses to individuals who seek medical attention for an individual experiencing a drug-related overdose. The law also ensures that minors engaged in underage drinking will not be prosecuted for possession or consumption if they seek medical attention for another individual.

Committee action: The committee did not have time to discuss this agenda item; It will be placed on the January committee agenda.

Board Action: None required.

CURRENT POSITION STATEMENT:

Departures from or closings of medical practices

Departures from or closings of medical practices are trying times. If mishandled, they can significantly disrupt continuity of care and endanger patients.

Provide Continuity of Care

Practitioners continue to have obligations toward their patients during and after the departure from or closing of a medical practice. Practitioners may not abandon a patient or abruptly withdraw from the care of a patient. Patients should therefore be given reasonable advance notice (at least 30 days) to allow other medical care to be secured. Good continuity of care includes preserving and providing appropriate access to medical records.* Also, good continuity of care may often include making appropriate referrals. The practitioner(s) and other parties that may be involved should ensure that the requirements for continuity of care are effectively addressed.

It is the position of the North Carolina Medical Board that during such times practitioners and other parties that may be involved in such processes must consider how their actions affect patients. In particular, practitioners and other parties that may be involved have the following obligations.

Permit Patient Choice

It is the patient's decision from whom to receive care. Therefore, it is the responsibility of all practitioners and other parties that may be involved to ensure that:

- Patients are notified in a timely fashion of changes in the practice and given the opportunity to seek other medical care, sufficiently far in advance (at least 30 days) to allow other medical care to be secured, which is often done by newspaper advertisement and by letters to patients currently under care;
- Patients clearly understand that they have a choice of health care providers;
- Patients are told how to reach any practitioner(s) remaining in practice, and when specifically requested, are told how to contact departing practitioners; and
- Patients are told how to obtain copies of or transfer their medical records.

No practitioner, group of practitioners, or other parties involved should interfere with the fulfillment of these obligations, nor should practitioners put themselves in a position where they cannot be assured these obligations can be met.

Written Policies

The Board recommends that practitioners and practices prepare written policies regarding the secure storage, transfer and retrieval of patient medical records. Practitioners and practices should notify patients of these policies. At a minimum, the Board recommends that such written policies specify:

- A procedure and timeline that describes how the practitioner or practice will notify each patient when appropriate about (1) a pending practice closure or practitioner departure, (2) how medical records are to be accessed, and (3) how future notices of the location of the practice's medical records will be provided;
- How long medical records will be retained;
- The procedure by which the practitioner or practice will dispose of unclaimed medical records after a specified period of time;

- How the practitioner or practice shall timely respond to requests from patients for copies of their medical records or to access to their medical records; In the event of the practitioner's death or incapacity, how the deceased practitioner's executor, administrator, personal representative or survivor will notify patients of the location of their medical records and how patients can access those records; and
- The procedure by which the deceased or incapacitated practitioner's executor, administrator, personal representative or survivor will dispose of unclaimed medical records after a specified period of time.

The Board further expects that its licensees comply with any applicable state and/or federal law or regulation pertaining to a patient's protected healthcare information.

*NOTE: The Board's Position Statement on the Retention of Medical Records applies, even when practices close permanently due to the retirement or death of the practitioner.

Issue: As a result of Board Action at the July 2013 meeting Dr. Kirby has put together a proposal on whether the Administrative Medicine PLOC, Scope of Practice PLOC, Telemedicine PLOC and PA/MD PLOC should remain PLOCs. Additionally, staff has put together an example of how the message in these PLOCs can be incorporated into the "Now Licensed" letter that is sent to all new licensees, when applicable.

CURRENT POSITION STATEMENT

Telemedicine

“Telemedicine” is the practice of medicine using electronic communication, information technology or other means between a licensee in one location and a patient in another location with or without an intervening health care provider.

The Board recognizes that technological advances have made it possible for licensees to provide medical care to patients who are separated by some geographical distance. As a result, telemedicine is a potentially useful tool that, if employed appropriately, can provide important benefits to patients, including: increased access to health care, expanded utilization of specialty expertise, rapid availability of patient records, and the reduced cost of patient care.

The Board cautions, however, that licensees practicing via telemedicine will be held to the same standard of care as licensees employing more traditional in-person medical care. A failure to conform to the appropriate standard of care, whether that care is rendered in-person or via telemedicine, may subject the licensee to potential discipline by this Board.

The Board provides the following considerations to its licensees as guidance in providing medical services via telemedicine:

Training of Staff -- Staff involved in the telemedicine visit should be trained in the use of the telemedicine equipment and competent in its operation.

Examinations -- Licensees using telemedicine technologies to provide care to patients located in North Carolina must provide an appropriate examination prior to diagnosing and/or treating the patient. However, this examination need not be in-person if the technology is sufficient to provide the same information to the licensee as if the exam had been performed face-to-face.

Other examinations may also be considered appropriate if the licensee is at a distance from the patient, but a licensed health care professional is able to provide various physical findings that the licensee needs to complete an adequate assessment. On the other hand, a simple questionnaire without an appropriate examination may be a violation of law and/or subject the licensee to discipline by the Board.¹

Licensee-Patient Relationship – The licensee using telemedicine should have some means of verifying that the person seeking treatment is in fact who he or she claims to be. A diagnosis should be established through the use of accepted medical practices, i.e., a patient history, mental status examination, physical examination and appropriate diagnostic and laboratory testing. Licensees using telemedicine should also ensure the availability for appropriate follow-up care and maintain a complete medical record that is available to the patient and other treating health care providers.

Medical Records -- The licensee treating a patient via telemedicine must maintain a complete record of the telemedicine patient’s care according to prevailing medical record standards. The medical record serves to document the analysis and plan of an episode of care for future reference. It must reflect an appropriate evaluation of the patient's presenting symptoms, and relevant components of the electronic professional interaction must be documented as with any other encounter.

The licensee must maintain the record’s confidentiality and disclose the records to the patient consistent with state and federal law. If the patient has a primary care provider and a

telemedicine provider for the same ailment, then the primary care provider's medical record and the telemedicine provider's record constitute one complete patient record.

Licensure -- The practice of medicine is deemed to occur in the state in which the patient is located. Therefore, any licensee using telemedicine to regularly provide medical services to patients located in North Carolina should be licensed to practice medicine in North Carolina.² Licensees need not reside in North Carolina, as long as they have a valid, current North Carolina license.

North Carolina licensees intending to practice medicine via telemedicine technology to treat or diagnose patients outside of North Carolina should check with other state licensing boards. Most states require physicians to be licensed, and some have enacted limitations to telemedicine practice or require or offer a special registration. ¹ See also the Board's Position Statement entitled "Contact with Patients before Prescribing."

² N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-18(c)(11) exempts from the requirement for licensure: "The practice of medicine or surgery by any nonregistered reputable physician or surgeon who comes into this State, either in person or by use of any electronic or other mediums, on an irregular basis, to consult with a resident registered physician or to consult with personnel at a medical school about educational or medical training. This proviso shall not apply to physicians resident in a neighboring state and regularly practicing in this State."

The Board also notes that the North Carolina General Statutes define the practice of medicine as including, "The performance of any act, within or without this State, described in this subdivision by use of any electronic or other means, including the Internet or telephone." N.C. Gen. Stat. § 90-1.1(5)f

Applicable Professional Corporation Statute**§ 55B-10. Registration with licensing board.**

No professional corporation shall open, operate, or maintain an establishment for any of the purposes set forth in this Chapter without first having obtained a certificate of registration from the licensing board or boards. Applications for such registration shall be made to the licensing board or boards in writing and shall contain the name and address of the corporation and such other information as may be required by the licensing board or boards. If the board finds that no disciplinary action is pending before the board against any of the licensed incorporators, officers, directors, shareholders or employees of such corporation, **and if it appears that such corporation will be conducted in compliance with the law and the regulations of the board**, the board shall issue, upon the payment of a registration fee, not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00), a certificate of registration which shall remain effective until January 1 following the date of such registration or until such other expiration or renewal date as may be established by law or by the regulations of the licensing board.

ARTICLE
I
OFFICES

Section 1. Principal Office. The Board shall have a principal office in North Carolina.

Section 2. Other Offices. The Board may have other offices.

ARTICLE
II
BOARD POWERS, COMMITTEES, AND
COMPENSATION

Section 1. General Powers. The Board itself has all its general powers.

Section 2. Committees. The Board may designate one or more Committees. The President shall appoint Committee members. Committees have no powers other than: (a) to review matters and recommend actions to the Board; (b) to initiate or continue investigations or inquiries, including, in the eCommittees' sole discretion, the use of Board process (subpoenas, orders, or the like) in furtherance thereof; (c) to empower staff, either generally or in a specific instance, to initiate or continue investigations or inquiries, including, in the eCommittees' sole discretion, the use of Board orders to produce documents or things; (d) to employ experts to evaluate evidence in matter under investigation or inquiry; and (e) those powers authorized by the Board. The President shall serve as ex-officio member of all eCommittees.

Section 3. Executive Committee. There shall be an Executive Committee comprised of the Officers of the Board, who are chosen in accordance with Article IV of these Bylaws, along with the Immediate Past President of the Board and a member at large. The member at large shall be nominated and elected as provided in Article IV, Section 2. In the event the Immediate Past President is not available to serve on the Executive Committee, that position ~~may~~ shall be filled ~~as provided in Article IV, Section 2~~ by electing another member at large in accordance with Article IV, Section 2.

Section 4. Compensation. The Board may pay per diem and expenses to the maximum extent permitted by law.

ARTICLE III
MEETINGS OF THE
BOARD

Section 1. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings will occur as scheduled.

Section 2. Special or Emergency Meetings. Special or Emergency meetings of the Board may be called by the President or in the event of the unavailability of the President by the President-Elect.

Section 3. Notice of Meetings. Notices of meetings shall be given as required by law.

Section 4. Quorum. A quorum of the Board is a majority of the members.

Section 5. Manner of Acting. Except as otherwise provided herein, the Board acts by simple majority vote of the members present at a meeting at which there is a quorum. There shall be no proxy voting.

Section 6. Participation by Conference Telephone. The Board may meet by electronic means to the maximum extent permitted by law.

ARTICLE IV
OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers of the Board. The officers of the Board shall consist of a President, a President-Elect, and a Secretary/Treasurer.

Section 2. Election and Term. The President-Elect shall become President at the end of the President's term. The remaining officers of the Board shall be elected as follows: During the July Board meeting, the Executive Committee shall meet with the other members of the Board to solicit recommendations for the President-Elect, and Secretary/Treasurer and Member(s) at large positions. Thereafter, the Executive Committee shall retire to discuss a slate of candidates. The Executive Committee shall nominate to the Board a slate of candidates for the above offices for the coming term. The Board shall vote on the entire slate. The

slate is approved when a majority of the total membership of the Board votes in favor of the slate. This process shall continue at the Board's July meeting until a slate is elected.

The term of office is November 1st to October 31st.

Officers shall serve until a replacement is elected.

Section 3. Vacancies. In the event that the President fails to serve out his or her term as provided in this Article for whatever reason, then the President-Elect shall assume the office of President and hold the office of President for the remainder of the departed President's term. The President completing the term of the departed President shall be eligible to serve a full term as President after completing the term of the departed President.

In the event an officer other than the President fails to serve out his or her term as provided in this Article for whatever reason, the vacancy shall be filled as provided in Article IV, Section 2, at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting.

Section 4. Removal. Any officer may be removed from office by a vote of two-thirds ~~a~~ majority of the total membership of the Board at any time.

Section 5. President. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Board and shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board. The President shall sign documents for the Board. ~~The President may designate in writing three or more hearing officers to conduct hearings and shall assign cases to each hearing committee.~~

Section 6. President-Elect. The President-Elect shall, in the absence or disability of the President, have all the authority and perform the duties of the President.

Section 7. Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer shall have the responsibility and authority to maintain and authenticate the ~~records~~ minutes of the Board meetings. ~~And shall have charge and custody of all funds and securities belonging to the Board and shall keep, or cause to be kept, full and accurate records of the finances of the Board. At each~~ January meeting of the Board, the Secretary/Treasurer shall make a full report of receipts and disbursements since the previous annual report, together with a list of all outstanding

obligations of the Board. The Secretary/Treasurer shall, in the absence or disability of the President and the President-Elect, have all the authority and perform the duties of the President.

ARTICLE V
PROFESSIONAL
STAFF

Section 1. Professional Staff. The Board shall employ a Professional Staff to assist it, in whatever lawful way it may prescribe, in the discharge of its duties under and to enforce the laws regulating the practice of medicine or surgery.

Section 2. Executive Director. The Board shall employ an Executive Director who shall lead and manage, hire and dismiss, the Professional Staff. The Executive Director shall have the authority to execute all contracts on behalf of the Board. He or she shall have custody of the seal of the Board, and shall affix it to all documents executed on behalf of the Board or certified as emanating from the Board. The Executive Director shall take charge of all funds paid into the Board and deposit them in some bank selected by the Board; he or she shall cause books of accounts to be kept, which shall be the property of the Board. The officers of the Board shall evaluate the Executive Director annually and report to the Board.

ARTICLE VI
GENERAL
PROVISIONS

Section 1. Seal. The seal of the Board shall consist of two concentric circles between or within which is the name of the Board.

Section 2. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Board shall be ~~fixed by resolution of the Board of Directors~~from November 1 to October 31.

Section 3. Amendments. Except as otherwise provided herein or by applicable law, these Bylaws may be amended or repealed and new bylaws may be adopted after a thirty (30) day notice by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the total membership of the Board.

Section 4. Rules of Order. To the extent that matters of procedure are not addressed in these Bylaws or in applicable sections of the North Carolina General Statutes or North Carolina Administrative Code, the Board shall follow parliamentary procedure as set forth in The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure, 4th Edition, by Alice Sturges (McGraw Hill, Inc. 2001)
