Raleigh May 6<sup>th</sup> 1859.

The General Assembly of the State of North Carolina at the session of 1858-9 passed the following Act, entitled

An Act to incorporate the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina, and for the establishment of a Medical Board of Examiners.

Section 1. Incorporates the Medical Society as a body corporate.

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That from and after the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 1859, no person shall practise medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof, or in any case prescribe for the cure of disease for fee or reward, unless he or they shall have been licensed so to do in the manner hereinafter described: Provided, That no person who shall practise in violation of this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 3. Be it further enacted, That in order to the proper regulation of the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of North Carolina, there shall be established a board of regularly graduated physicians, to be known by the name and title of, "The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina".

Section 4. Be it further enacted, That the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina shall consist of seven regularly graduated physicians.

Section 5. Be it further enacted, That it shall be the duty of said board to examine all applicants for license to practise medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof, in the state of North Carolina on the following branches of medical science, viz: Anatomy, Physiology, Surgery, Pathology, Medical Hygiene, Chemistry, Pharmacy, Materia Medica, Therapeutics, Obstetrics, and the Practice of Medicine; and if, on such examination, he or they be found competent, to grant to such applicant or applicants a license or diploma authorizing him or them to practise medicine and surgery, or any of the branches thereof, in the State of North Carolina. Provided, That five members shall constitute a quorum.

and that four of those present shall be agreed as to the qualifications of the applicant.

Section 6. Be it further enacted, that the said board shall be at liberty to examine for and grant license to practise medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof, in this state, to any person so applying who shall give satisfactory evidence to the board, that he is twenty one years of age, and of good moral character. such applicants, if found competent, shall have granted to them the license before mentioned, signed by the Board of Medical Examiners, or a majority thereof, and if found incompetent they shall be rejected.

Section 7. Be it further enacted, that to prevent delay and inconvenience two members of the Board of Medical Examiners may grant a temporary license to applicants therefor, and make report thereof to the next regular meeting of the board for confirmation. Provided, that such temporary license shall not continue in force longer than the next regular meeting of the board, and that such temporary license shall in no case be granted after the applicant has been refused a license by the Board of Medical Examiners.

Section 8. Be it further enacted, that it shall be the duty of the Medical Society of the state of North Carolina to furnish to the General Assembly of the state of North Carolina by their secretary a list of members of that Society, from which list, the General Assembly shall elect seven to constitute the Board of Medical Examiners before mentioned, to continue in office for the term of six years from the date of their election. Provided that when any member of this board shall cease to be a member of the Medical Society of the state of North Carolina, either by resignation or expulsion, his office of medical examiner shall thereby be vacated.

Section 9. Be it further enacted, that the members of the state medical society shall have power to select Board of Medical Examiners, except when the legislature choose to exer

give this right.

Section 10. Be it further enacted, that the Board of Medical Examiners thus appointed shall assemble in the City of Raleigh and Morgantown alternately on the first Monday in May in every year, and shall remain in session from day to day until all applicants who may present themselves for examination within the first ten days after their meeting shall have been examined and disposed of.

Section 11. Be it further enacted, that the Board of Medical Examiners shall be and they are hereby authorized to elect all such officers, and to frame all such by-laws as may be necessary to carry this law into effect, and in the event of any vacancy, by death, resignation or otherwise of any member of said board, the board or a quorum thereof shall be and they are hereby empowered to fill all vacancies.

Section 12. Be it further enacted, that the board of Examiners shall keep a regular record of its proceedings in a book kept for that purpose, which shall always be open for inspection, and shall cause to be entered on a book kept for this purpose the name of each applicant for license, and the name of each applicant licensed to practise medicine and surgery, and the time of granting the same, together with the names of the members of the board present, and shall publish the name of those licensed in two of the newspapers published in the City of Raleigh within thirty days after the granting of the same.

Section 13. Be it further enacted, that the said board shall have power to demand of each applicant thus licensed the sum of ten dollars before issuing a license or diploma, and the sum of five dollars for each temporary license, to be paid to the Secretary of the board.

Section 14. Be it further enacted, that the members of the said board shall receive as a compensation for their services four dollars each per day during the time of their session in the City of Raleigh, and in addition thereto their travelling expenses to and from the City of Raleigh, to be paid by the Secretary of the board, out of any money in his hands, upon

the certificate of the president of the Board of Medical Examiners.

Section 15. Be it further enacted, that any person who shall practise medicine or surgery in this state without having first applied for and obtained license from the said board of Examiners as provided for by this act, shall not be entitled to sue for or recover before any magistrate or Court in this state any medical bill for services rendered in the practice of medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof.

Section 16. Be it further enacted, that the said board shall have the power to rescind any license granted by them, when upon satisfactory proof it shall appear that any physician thus licensed has been guilty of grossly immoral conduct.

Section 17. Be it further enacted, that the secretary of the Board of Medical Examiners shall give bond and good security to the president of the board for the safe keeping and proper payment of all moneys that may come into his hands under the provisions of this act.

Section 18. Be it further enacted, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to any person or persons now engaged in the practice of medicine and surgery in this state, but shall be construed as applying to those only who may hereafter propose to commence the practice of the same in the state of North Carolina.

Section 19. Be it further enacted, that this act shall be in force on and after the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 1859, and shall be considered a public act.

The Medical Society of the State of North Carolina at its tenth annual meeting held at Statesville in May 1859 adopted the above Bill and proceeded under the 9<sup>th</sup> section of said Bill, to the election of seven of its members to constitute the Board of Medical Examiners, which election resulted as follows: Drs. James M. Dickson, Wilmington; Charles

C. Johnson, Raleigh; Caleb Winslow, Hertford; Olin F. Mansour, Townsville; Wm W. McKee, Raleigh; Christopher Haffoldt, Morganton; and J. Graham Tull, New Bern.

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina, thus elected, met in the City of Raleigh on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1859, for the purpose of organizing, all the members of the Board being present.

Upon motion of Dr Charles E. Johnson of Raleigh, Dr Jas. H. Dickson of Wilmington was chosen President of the Board: and upon motion of Dr Wm W. McKee, Dr Samuel S. Brdell was elected Secretary and Treasurer.

The following By-laws were passed for the government of the Board

Rule 1. The Board shall elect one of their number President of the Board, who shall continue in office for the term of six years.

Rule 2. They shall appoint a secretary, who shall also act as Treasurer, and who shall continue in office until a successor is appointed.

Rule 3. The examination of applicants for license, shall be open before the Board, each member of the Board examining upon such branch of medical science as is allotted him.

The different branches of medical science were allotted the members of the Board as follows.

Dr. L. P. Warren, of Edenton, presented to the Board his testimonials as to Character &c: and applied for an examination. He was examined, approved: and a license granted accordingly.

The Board adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock A.M.

May 8<sup>th</sup> The Board met at 10 o'clock A.M. Present, Drs: Dickson, Manson, Full, Wappoldt, Johnson and McKee.

The following persons presented testimonials of character &c and applied for examination. W. A. Bloom, Washington: W. W. Dilly, Richmond Co: J. P. McCombs, Charlotte J. W. Shinn, Rowan Co: W. W. There being no applicants the Board adjourned until Monday 11 o'clock A.M.

May 14<sup>th</sup> The Board met according to adjournment. Present, Drs. Dickson, Manson, Tull, Haffoldt, Johnson and McKee.

Dr. G. T. Emmet of Baslow, applied for an examination. He was examined, approved, and a license granted.

The Board adjourned to meet at 11 o'clock A.M.

May 15<sup>th</sup> The Board met according to adjournment. Present, Drs. Manson, Tull, Haffoldt, Johnson and McKee.

Dr. Dickson being absent, Dr. Manson was called to preside over the Board.

It was ordered that the Secretary shall give a bond of five hundred dollars to the President of the Board for the safe keeping of the books and funds of the Board, as prescribed by the act of incorporation.

The Board adjourned to meet at 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  o'clock A.M.

May 16<sup>th</sup> The Board met according to adjournment. Present, Drs. Manson, Tull, Haffoldt, Johnson and McKee.

Raleigh May 16<sup>th</sup> 1861

There being no business before the Board, and the term of the session expiring by law, the Board adjourned to meet in Morgan town on the first Monday in May 1861.

An Act to amend Chapter 258 of private laws of 1858-59

entitled an Act to incorporate the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina, and for the establishment of a Medical Board of Examiners, ratified the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1859

Section 1. The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact, That Chapter 258 of the Private Laws of 1858-59, be amended by striking out Section 10 thereof, and inserting in lieu thereof, the following:

Sec. 10. Be it further enacted, "That the Board of Medical Examiners there appointed shall assemble at the same times and places, when and where the aforesaid Medical Society assembles, which said Society shall assemble at least once in each and every year at such time and place as the said Society at its next preceding meeting shall have fixed; and the said Board shall remain in session from day to day until all applicants who may present themselves for examination within the first five days after its meeting, shall have been examined and disposed of.

Sect. 2. That the said chapter be further amended by striking out Section 14 thereof, and inserting the following:

Sec. 14. Be it further enacted, That the members of the said Board shall receive as a compensation for their services four dollars each per day during the time of their session, and in addition thereto, their traveling expenses to and from their places of meeting, by the most direct route from their respective places of residence, to be paid by the Secy of the Board out of any moneys in his hands, upon the certificate of the Pres of the Board of Medical Examiners.

Section 10. That this act shall be in force and effect, from and after the date of its passage.

In accordance with a resolution introduced at the last meeting, the secretary prepared a report of the proceedings of the Board of Med. Examiners during its term of office, which was read before the State Med. Society, and upon motion, ordered to be published in its transactions.

The report is, as follows:

Report of the Fourth Board of Med. Examiners of the State of North Carolina, at the conclusion of their term of office May 22<sup>nd</sup> 1884.

The Legislature of North Carolina, on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February 1859 passed "An act to incorporate the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina, and for the establishment of a Medical Board of Examiners."

In this paper a brief history is given, of the work accomplished by the Board of Med. Examiners, during the twenty-five years of its existence.

The law, as originally passed, required the Medical Examiners to meet alternately in Raleigh and Morgan-son, on the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday in May of every year. Only in 1871, was the law so amended, that they were allowed to meet at the same times and places, as the Medical Society assembled, and traveling expenses and a small

per diem were to be paid out of such money, as they might receive from the granting of licenses. That under such difficulties and hardships the Board maintained its existence, is certainly creditable to the medical profession in North Carolina.

Previous to the organization of the present Board, a branch of Medicine was assigned to each examiner, who for the six years of his term, conducted examinations on that branch alone. The present Board, at its first meeting, instituted a system of rotation, so that each member would examine on a different branch each year. The first examination of the applicant for license, was conducted privately by each examiner. The notes of these examinations were afterwards compared, at a meeting of the whole Board, and the result determined by vote. In cases where a re-examination was required, this was conducted before the whole Board, and a member of the Board was selected by the President, to examine on such branches, as had, at the first examination, been assigned to other members of the Board. The fairness of this method can not be questioned, and the unanimity of opinion thus acquired by the whole Board, in the case of each applicant examined, was most remarkable. In the light of these explanations, the following tabulated statement is interesting:

Recapitulation.

The first Board of Med. Examiners examined 34 applicants, granted license to 31 and refused 3.

The second Board granted 21 licenses.

The third Board granted 66 licenses, and refused 1.

Under these three Boards therefore, a total of 122 were examined, of whom 118 received license.

(Note. It is probable that no accurate record was kept, of applicants who were refused license.)

During the six years of its existence, the fourth Board of Med. Examiners has examined 208 applicants for license. To 183 of these, licenses were granted. 25 were found unfit to receive license, and of this number 16 were graduates of chartered medical schools.

In conclusion, the retiring Board return their sincere thanks to the Med. Society, the Press, and the people of the State, for their cordial support and co-operation. They have endeavored to do their duty, without fear, favor, or prejudice, and now resign their trust, into the hands of those from whom, six years ago, they received it. They retire from their arduous and most unpleasant field of labor, with the belief, that their conscientious efforts to maintain the standard of medical education, and protect the people of their State against ignorance and incompetency, have not been in vain.

Raleigh May, 19/85  
I think the Board of Med. Exs. can meet at times & places other than the meetings of the State Med. Society. The Statute requires, that the Board of Med. Exs. shall meet at the time & place, where the Society shall assemble, but it does not prohibit them from meeting at other times & places. I feel quite confident, that licenses granted or renewed at a special meeting, would be as valid and lawful as if issued or directed at the regular annual meeting. The spirit of the law is that, the profession and the public shall be protected from ignorance and malpractice by means of examinations by competent persons preliminary to the right to practice and at the same time to offer to gentlemen desiring to enter the medical profession, and who may have qualified themselves, regular opportunity at least once a year, to make application for examination & license. It certainly cannot be considered a

violation of the act, if the facilities for Examination are extended, while the guards prescribed by the statute are preserved. While the Board may assemble at other times & places it cannot dispense with the necessity or requirement for its meeting contemporaneously with the Society. ....

The following amendments to the act regulating the Practice of Medicine was ordered to be spread upon the minutes:

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

Section 1. That Section 3122 of the Code be amended by striking out the words, "provided no person who shall practice ~~medicine~~ in violation of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor"

Sec. 2. That section 3132 of the Code be amended by adding at the end of said section the following: And Any person who shall begin the practice of medicine or surgery in this State for fee or reward, after the passage of this act, without first having obtained license from said Board of Examiners, shall not only not be entitled to sue for or recover before any court any medical bill for services rendered in the practice of medicine or surgery, or any of the branches thereof, but shall also be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Twenty Five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisoned, at the discretion of the Court, for each and every offence. Provided that this act shall not be construed to apply to women who pursue the avocation of a midwife; And provided further, that this act shall not apply to regularly licensed physicians or Surgeons Resident in a Neighboring State.

Sec. 3. That this act shall be in force from and after its Ratification. In the General Assembly read three times, and Ratified this, the 23<sup>d</sup> day Feb'y. A. D. 1885

An act to amend Section 3132 of the Code.

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact;  
Section 1. That Section 3132 of the Code be amended by adding after the last word of said act section the words "Provided, that this section shall not apply to physicians who have a diploma from a regular medical college prior to January the 1<sup>st</sup> 1880.

W. Knox J. Duffy, P. L. Murphy, Miles Alston, Jas. A. Reagen. The minutes of the last meeting in Charlotte 1887 were read & approved. Upon motion of Dr. Knox the Board agreed to adopt the method of written Examinations at the next Annual meeting. A Committee, Drs. Knox, Murphy & Reagen were appointed to draft rules to govern the method of conducting written Examinations. Moved by Dr. Knox, that every R & E examination at this meeting be in writing and at least two members of the Board shall be present during the R & E Examinations. The Secretary was also directed to return the fee of \$5.00 for temporary license to Dr. E. B. Rankin Raleigh, N.C. upon the surrender of the license

The Secretary was instructed to notify holders of Temporary licenses, through the North Carolina Medical Journal, to return them to him. The Secretary was instructed to inform Dr. J. The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at Elizabeth City N. C. April 13<sup>th</sup> 1889

Present Dr. William R. Wood, President and Examiner on Chemistry and Pharmacy; Dr. W. J. W. Bellamy, Secretary and Examiner on Materia Medica and Therapeutics; Dr. Francis Duffy, Examiner on Surgery, Surgical Pathology and Diseases of the Eye and Ear; Dr. P. L. Murphy, Examiner on Anatomy; Dr. James A. Reagan, Examiner on Physiology; Dr. William Alston, Examiner on Practice of Medicine. Absent A. W. Knox, M.D. Ex. on Obstetrics &c. The minutes of the last meeting held in Fayetteville were read and approved.

Dr. Knox being absent Dr. Duffy & Reagan was appointed in his place on the Committee on Rules governing Written Examinations. The report of the Committee was taken up and rules were adopted as follows:

#### Rule 1st

In the Examination of candidates as many are to be examined at the same time as the circumstances will permit, making each section as large as possible.

#### Rule 2

Two members of the Board shall be present with each section during the examination unless by consent one may be absent for a short while.

#### Rule 3

One of the examiners present shall not be engaged in any business except supervising

the examinations at the time it is going on, to prevent irregularities

#### Rule IV

Each candidate shall, <sup>his papers with a *Notre de plume*</sup> sign <sup>4 sheets</sup> a written pledge that he has neither given nor received any information concerning the examination, or used any unfair means; this pledge, to be given to the Examiner with his real ~~or~~ assumed name in a sealed envelope. When the paper <sup>has</sup> <sup>been</sup> finally passed upon, the Secretary shall open the envelope, and attach the pledge and the name to the paper, bearing the name found in the envelope.

#### Rule V

Any candidate found guilty of violating his pledge in giving or receiving information shall be adjudged guilty of grossly immoral conduct and shall be rejected.

#### Rule VI

There shall be one set of questions for each section and the same set shall not be used by any other section.

#### Rule VII

Each Section shall be allowed four hours to complete the examination on the brand the section is on; the time, for cause may be extended to six hours by the Examiners conducting the examination.

#### Rule VIII

The candidate shall make 70 percent this year according to the Rules of the Board, but for

but for the year 1890 the minimum standards will be 80 per cent

### Rule IX

Any candidate who does not make ~~more than~~ 33 $\frac{1}{3}$  per cent on any one branch shall be rejected; yet for cause he may be permitted to have a second examination on that branch; and if he does not get ~~more than~~ 33 $\frac{1}{3}$  per cent his rejection shall be final

### Rule X

The Board may, under certain circumstances, supplement the written examination with an oral examination, or, in extreme cases may substitute an oral for a written examination.

Dr Murphy moved that all examinations in the future for temporary licenses shall be oral. Carried

The examination papers of Drs S. N. Cannady, J. W. Taylor, J. H. Fay, W. H. Hughes (coll), Albert Anderson, W. F. Stokes, E. C. Starns, G. I. White, E. Q. Houston, R. H. Whitehead, and W. F. Ross having been carefully reviewed by the examiners, it was ordered that licenses be issued to them upon the payment to the Secretary & Treasurer of the usual fee.

Upon motion, it was decided that when the general average of the candidate was found to be above  $66\frac{2}{3}$  per cent, the applicant was allowed to withdraw his application and he was <sup>also</sup> permitted to stand an examination during the year for temporary license.

A large hall, with all the necessary conveniences, was obtained, and the written examinations were conducted by two of the Examiners upon one or two Branches at a time, depending upon the size of the class. At all times two of the Examiners, according to the Rules of the Board, were necessarily present.

Information having reached the Board of Medical Examiners concerning the dispensing of liquor indiscriminately and injudiciously ~~made~~ by licensees of the Board, it was <sup>in</sup> the sense of the Board that in any case where such

could be proven <sup>to be</sup> true, it would be a cause for rescinding the license of such physician, and all physicians in good standing as well as others interested in the preservation of the morals

of the people, are respectfully requested to notify the Secretary of such unprofessional and immoral conduct.

Upon motion of Dr. Murphy the Secretary was instructed to notify each individual member of the Board to be on his guard not to issue another temporary license to one Dr. Francis Just of "Keyser" W.B. against whom charges of grossly immoral conduct have <sup>been</sup> proffered at the Elizabeth City meeting; was notified that such charges would be made and was requested to be present to meet them. Notwithstanding this notice he failed to appear and sent no communication whatever to the Board on the subject.

The Secretary was also instructed to obtain from Dr. Just the temporary license issued him as the same was no longer in force, also that Dr. Caviness be written to concerning this action. It was suggested for the consideration of the members of the Board to meet next year at Oxford on Wednesday of the week preceding the meeting of the Society at 9 A.M. for examinations ect. In order that applicants may have an opportunity of getting through and join the society and to give the Board and to give

the Board ample time to close up its final years work properly

After the examinations were finished and the papers graded, it was ascertained that Dr W. H. Cobb Jr of Goldsboro N.C. had obtained the highest general average and was clearly entitled to the prize of Twenty Five Dollars or its value in medical publications annually afforded by Appleton & Co of New York upon condition that he becomes a member of the State Medical Society.

Of the Sixty three (63) applicants for license, the following 45 - who had complied properly with all the preliminary requirements, and having submitted to a thorough written Examination upon all the branches of Medicine & Surgery, were duly licensed.

Present Dr. A. W. Knox Examiner on Obstetrics &c Dr. F. Duffy Examiner on Surgery &c Dr. Willis Heston Examiner on Practice of Medicine &c Dr. P. L. Murphy Examiner on Anatomy Dr. H. J. N. Bellamy Examiner on Materia Medica &c. Absent Dr. Wm. R. Wood President & Examiner on Chemistry Dr. J. A. Regan Examiner on Physiology &c. (The last two Examiners appeared on Monday morning.) In the absence of the President Dr. Knox was called to the chair

& the minutes of the last meeting were read and after some additional matter was added they were approved.

Rule IX was upon motion altered so as to strike out "more than" in second line and "more than" in sixth line see page 78 "Minute book" also Rule VII was altered so as to strike all after "is on;" in the third line. It was moved by Dr. Heston that that portion of the minutes of 1889 in reference to the indiscriminate dispensing of intoxicating liquors & beverages upon prescriptions of Physicians shall be published in one religious paper of each denomination in North Carolina and also in the "Churchman" published in the North. — carried.

It was moved and carried that Dr. Duffy & Knox be appointed a Committee to write & consult the

Attorney General in regard to those Physicians who failed to register on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1890, having been qualified to do so, and also concerning those who registered from having been in practice prior to Mich 7<sup>th</sup> 1885, but have never received a license from the board, and are now known to be guilty of grossly immoral conduct" Can this Board annul the registration Certificate and take away the privilege of such men from practising in this State? The letter was as follows:

Dear Sir:

There are a number of Physicians in North Carolina, who, according to the terms of the recent amendment of the laws regulating the practice of Medicine in this State, were entitled to register before Jan'y 1<sup>st</sup> 1890 — as legally qualified practitioners — of Medicine, but who, from various causes, failed to exercise their privileges during the time prescribed by law, and have therefore, under the operation of the law, become debarred from practising Medicine. Some of these persons are licentiates of the Board of Medical Examiners; others are not. The Board of Examiners find themselves in an awkward position, owing to this unexpected hardship, which has befallen many

and desire, if they can lawfully do so, to exercise their discretion in licensing such persons without examination, so as to restore them to their rights, as contemplated under the law.

It is obvious that many of these men would not be able to stand the Examination, as they are now conducted; and the Examiners are unwilling to hold merely formal and perfunctory Examinations, and then confer on these men "licenses or diplomas" setting forth high qualifications and couched in the same language as the licenses obtained by those who have successfully stood the severe tests. We desire from you an expression of opinion as to the extent of the powers of the Board of Examiners in these matters, and as to the legality of framing such form of license and conferring the same on the persons in question without examination, so as to restore them to their former rights, which have been forfeited through inadvertence or unavoidable circumstances.

There are good reasons why the time limiting the privilege of registration should not be extended by the Legislature; for instance one, making oath that he had been in the practice of "Medicine before a certain time, was allowed to register. This was sometimes construed to admit druggists and

charlatans not contemplated as practitioners under the law. We desire to ask your opinion on another point, viz: The Board of Examiners are empowered, under the law, to rescind licenses licenses of licentiates guilty of "grossly immoral conduct". Are the powers of the Board, in these respects restricted to persons having licenses or are they the custodians or guardians of the morals of all the legally - qualified practitioners of the State? It would be obviously unjust and discriminating, if licentiates of the Board could be debarred from practicing Medicine on account of grossly immoral conduct, while other practitioners, not licentiates of the Board, could not be so debarred for the same cause. For your convenience we enclose a copy of the codified laws on these subjects, including recent amendments. Please let us hear from you as soon as possible during the present session of our Board, as these are questions requiring an early solution and likely to occur on Monday or Tuesday. Gentlemen:

Your letter of the 24<sup>th</sup> just reached me last night — apprehending that you might have occasion to act upon the matter before a letter could reach you. I, this morning telegraphed my opinion upon the first point submitted. The conclusion I reached is that, the purpose of the Decision of the Board being to provide a test for the qualifications of those who may desire to engage in the practice of "Medicine in this State". Where a person has submitted once to that test and has been found possessed of the necessary qualifications, it was not essential that another examination should be had before he was entitled to register under the recent act. The first examination will be presumed to have furnished all the information to the Board necessary to the exercise of its powers to license. I do not mean to say that the Board is bound in every ~~way~~ <sup>instance</sup> to grant the license without an additional examination for there may be cases in

which it would be proper to reexamine  
 the applicant, but I think a sensible  
 and practicable construction of the  
 law will confer upon the Board  
 sound discussion of the the  
 matter. For reasons satisfactory  
 to itself, the General Assembly  
 exempted those persons designated  
 in the last proviso of Sec. 3132  
 of the Code — as it now stands  
 — from an examination by the  
 Board, and I think they are upon  
 the same footing as those who have  
 been licensed after Examination —  
 The Board might however feel  
 it right to exercise the discretion  
 which I have said they have in  
 respect to those who have been  
 examined and licensed, with  
 greater caution. The reasons  
 for this are obvious, doubtless  
 to the Profession: I am inclined  
 to the opinion that the power to  
 revoke license under Sec. 3133  
 The Code; ~~the~~ is confined to those  
 cases where the Board has granted  
 the license. Since the Registration  
 Act, it might be, the Board under  
 the conditions imposed in the  
 Statutes. Could revoke or vacate  
 the license issued upon a  
 proper registration, but this is  
 conjecture, and I venture to sug-  
 gest, that it will be more prudent  
 not to attempt the exercise of a  
 doubtful power in so delicate  
 and grave matter. The General

Assembly will be in session before the next regular meeting of the Board and no doubt will amend the law in all proper respects. Hoping the delay in responding to your letter has given the Board no inconvenience.

The Board of Medical Examiners met at the rooms of the Oston House at 10 A.M., Monday, May 16<sup>th</sup>.

There were present, W. H. Whitbread, President, W. S. Picot, Secretary, W. Geo. Gilbert Thomas, W. R. S. Payne, Jr., & W. Geo. W. Song.

The President appointed W. Thomas & Song a Committee on Finance. They examined & approved the vouchers of the Secretary. On motion of W. Thomas, it was ordered that W. Picot be reimbursed for his travelling expenses as a witness to Alamanac Court in the case of W. Cummings vs Huffman, & Gurringer, Executors.

It was ordered, on motion of W. Payne, that so much of rule of former Board allowing the withdrawal of a candidate, his grade on examination being above 66 2/3 per cent, with permission to apply for temporary license, be amended by the following words -

provided that only one temporary license shall be issued to any applicant under this rule. (See Page 79 of Records of former Board for rules).

W. Song & Durefoy came in on the afternoon train & reported for duty.

The first examination was held by W. Thomas, on Chemistry, at the rooms of the Young Men's Christian Association. Two examinations were held daily & on Wednesday Three, one of them, on Materia Medica & Therapeutics, at night.

W. Purroy moved that a temporary

license be issued to W. H. B. Warren if one has never been granted in the past.

W. Payne moved that after this year the Board will not grant a temporary license to any applicant who has had one temporary license & an opportunity for full examination & fails to pass. That so much of rule of former Board, now in force, allowing withdrawal, & granting temporary license until the next regular examination be amended. The motion was withdrawn, & W. Payne then moved that the Secretary obtain an opinion from the Attorney General as to our authority in the matter. Carried.

W. H. B. Kier, of Rippsville, was granted an oral examination in his bed, on account of an attack of Dementia.

The examinations were written as heretofore, & a standard of 80 per cent. required.

The Board of Medical Examiners met in the City of Raleigh, Rooms of Garborough House, on Monday, May 8<sup>th</sup>, 1893, at 10 O'clock, A.M. The following members were present: President H. H. Whitehead, Secretary S. J. Picot, J. M. Parker, Robt S. Young, and H. B. Heaver. W<sup>rs</sup> Geo. H. Long and Geo. Gilbert Thomas came in later and reported for duty. The Minutes of the Meeting held last at Wilmington were <sup>read</sup> and approved. W<sup>rs</sup> Whitehead and Thomas, Comm. on Finance, audited the Treasurer's acct and found them correct. Obstetrics and Gynaecology was assigned to W<sup>r</sup> J. M. Parker, and Physiology to W<sup>r</sup> H. B. Heaver.

According to instructions at former meeting, a letter was read by Secretary Picot. The Attorney Guil declined to give the Board an official legal opinion on the point in question.

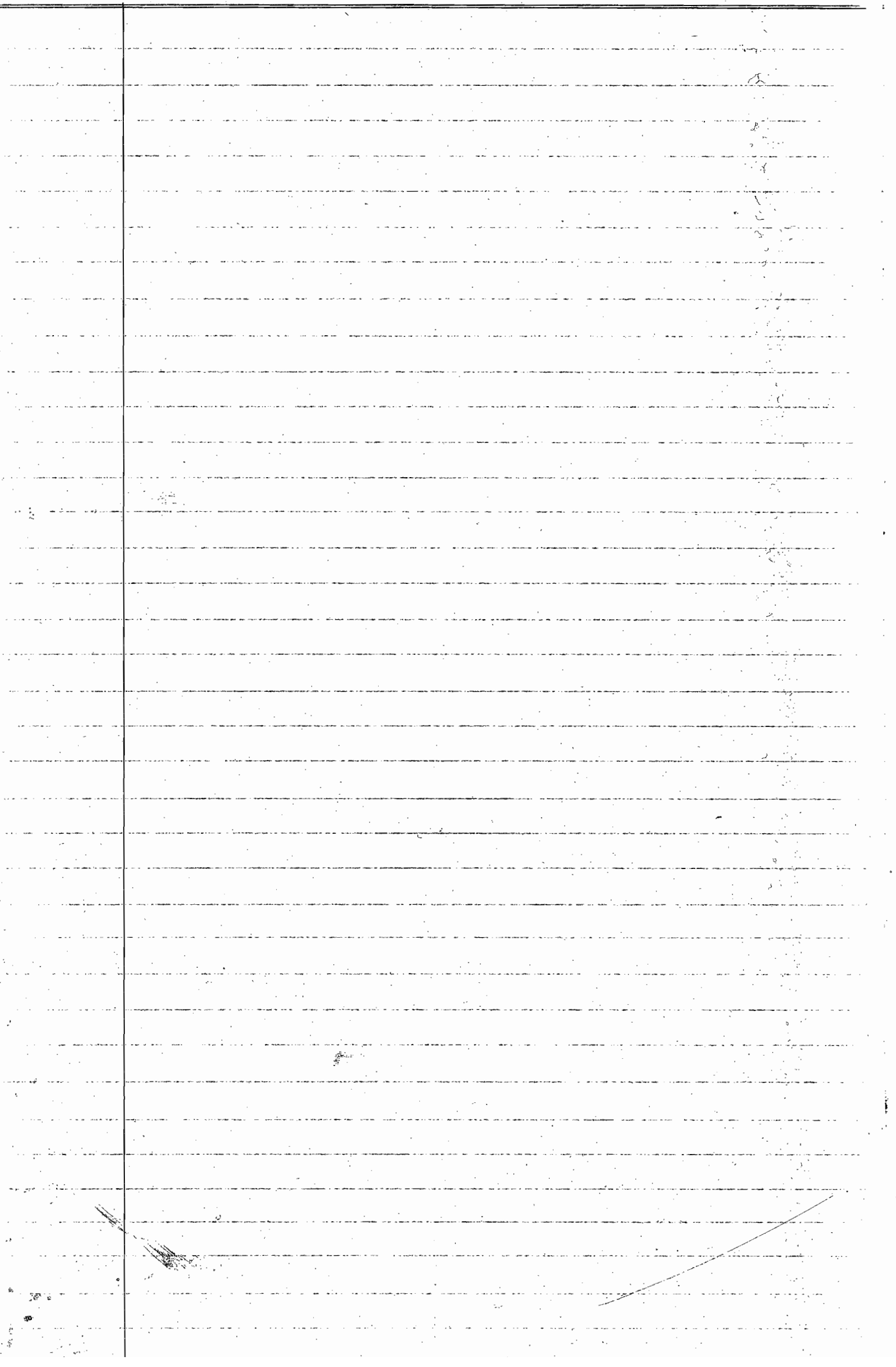

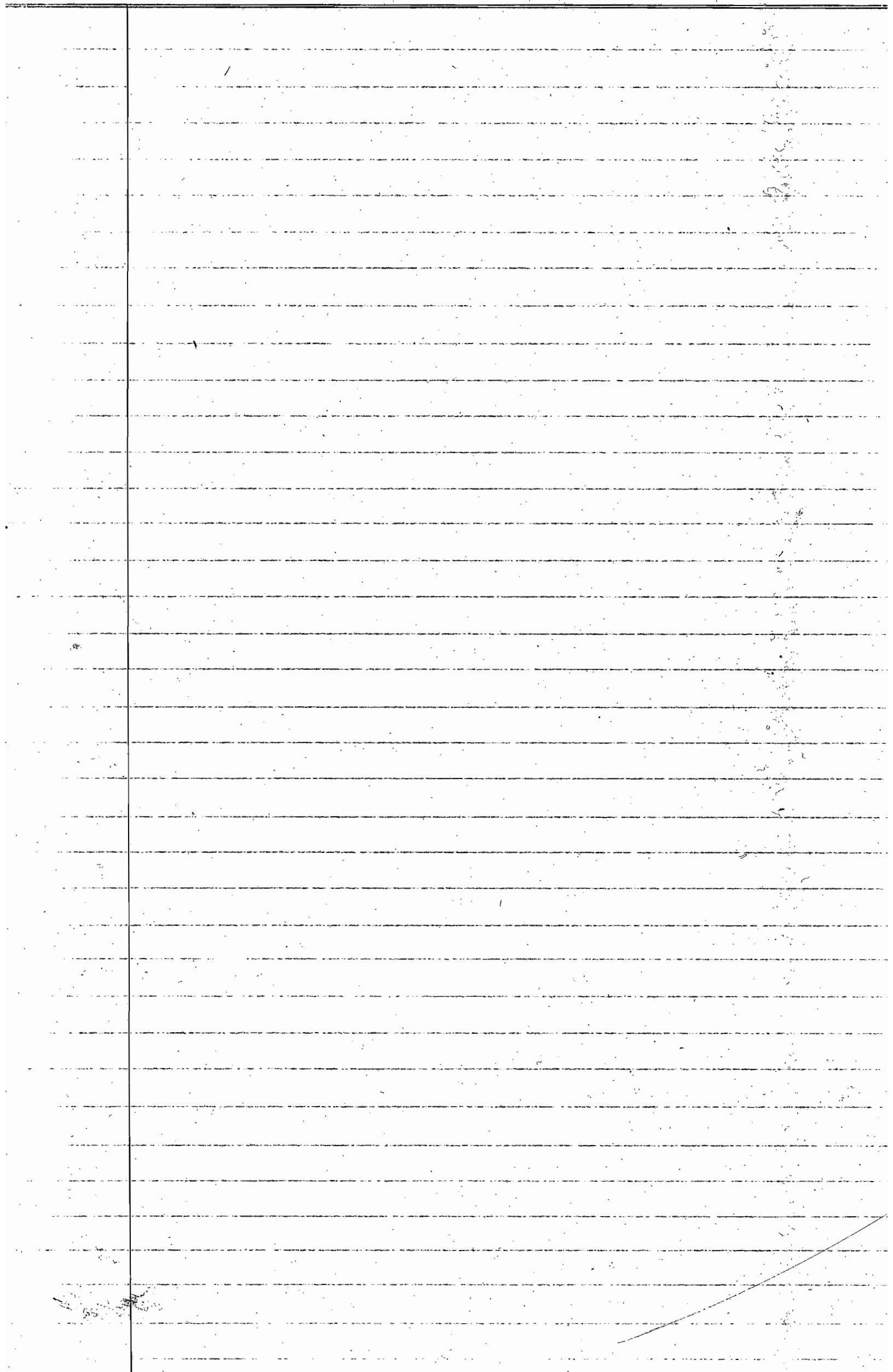

The Board of Medical Examiners met in the City of Winston-Salem, Hotel Phoenix, Room no. 3, on Monday, May 11<sup>th</sup>, 1896, at 9. A. M. There were present

The morning was spent in the registration of applicants for license.

W<sup>rs</sup> Whitehead held the first examination for W<sup>rs</sup> Baker on Surgery in the afternoon. W<sup>rs</sup> Burbank sent

in his question on Anatomy, and they were used in the examination on that Branch.

W<sup>rs</sup> Whitehead held the examinations on Obstetrics & Gynaecology & Pediatrics.



Dr. Weaver and Hitchhead held clinical examination in bandaging. The other examinations were all written and the grade of 80 per cent required.

Dr. A. J. McDevitt asked for permission to register, this having been denied him, he presented himself for examination. Dr. J. I. Clark of Porells Point, sent in an application for a permit to register. It was decided that his evidence was not sufficient, in fact not respectable, and it was ordered that his fee be returned to him with or without his papers.

Dr. G. J. Parlear was granted an oral examination on account of the loss of an eye.

The examinations were markedly better than in former years, & the rejection fewer.

The Board of Medical Examiners met at Woodhead City June 7<sup>th</sup> 1897. The Board was called to order by President Baker at 9 P. M. Members present were Dr. Baker, Weaver, Taylor, Burbanks, Anderson and Whitehead.

The matter of Dr. J. S. Bullock was called up in regard to practicing prior to 1885. A number of affidavits were read from various parties and the certificate of the clerk of the Superior Court of Pitt Co. After the matter was discussed it was decided that Dr. Bullock, on motion of Dr. Weaver, should be granted a permit to register after he submits a sworn statement before the Clerk of the Superior Court of Pitt Co. that he was practicing in this state prior to 1885.

Dr. Anderson brought up the matter of Dr. J. M. Flippin and it was decided that on motion of Dr. Burbanks that he be permitted to register. Likewise Dr. James Allen's case was presented on similar grounds of affidavits from various parties. Dr. Flippin was granted and Dr. Allen's case was deferred to a future meeting, and that Dr. Allen be notified by Secretary to appear in person before final action be taken and with certificate from clerk of the court that he had made oath that he was practicing prior to 1885.

Dr. Peot presented the matter of Dr. Pendleton and asks for continuation of temporary license on account

of illness. On motion of Dr. Taylor that his license be extended till next meeting of Board. So ordered and that Secretary notify him of same.

Dr. R. W. Moore came before the Board in explanation of his <sup>case</sup> in regard to his registration in 1891. It was decided that Dr. Moore be given an oral examination.

On motion of Dr. Weaver a committee of three, Dr. Anderson, Burbank and Taylor, were appointed to draft resolutions of respect in regard to the death of Dr. Hayes.

A vacancy being announced, Dr. Burbank nominated Dr. ~~W.~~ Kemp P. Battle, of Raleigh, seconded by Dr. Taylor. Dr. Battle was unanimously elected to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Hayes. Dr. Battle was assigned to the Chair of Chemistry.

Dr. R. H. Whitehead offered his resignation to the Board, giving as his reason, being connected with the ~~State~~ University where a quiz is conducted.

Dr. Taylor moved that \$4.00 be paid to each member who conducts any temporary ~~license~~ examination out of any funds in the treasury at next meeting after such examination. Motion seconded and carried.

Dr. R. W. Moore received 66% average grade on examination, and consequently license was not granted him. It was ordered by the Board

That the Secretary be instructed to communicate with Secretary of Com. American Examining & Licensing Board and ascertain the status of N.C. Examining Board and pay the sum of \$10.00 for his year each of membership in same.

Dr. Hiden was granted a partial oral examination on account of sickness; the balance written.

Dr. W. H. Cornell was discovered in using unfair means in his examination. He was ordered to fix the Board, and after a mild reprimand for his grossly immoral conduct, he was not allowed to be considered an applicant for license and was rejected from the class and Secretary ordered to refund him his fee of \$10.00.

The examinations began on Tuesday morning by Dr. Weaver on the branches of Obe., Hy., and Ped.

Dr. Baker held his examination on surgery in the afternoon of same day. The examinations were continued on Wednesday by Dr. Whitehead on Anatomy in the morning and Dr. Burbank on practice in the afternoon.

On Thursday Drs. Anderson, Taylor and Battle held their examinations on Physiology, Materia Medica, Therapeutics and Chemistry respectively.

Dr. Weaver held clinical demonstration in Obe. on Manipulation and Dr. Whitehead gave practical work

with microscope on Histology and Pathology. On motion the rule requiring papers to be preserved was abolished by a unanimous vote. There was an expression of opinion favorable to the reciprocity between N.C. and Va. Boards. On motion it was left discretionary with Sec. & Pres. in regard to the matter.

On motion of Dr. Mann it was moved and seconded that Dr. Baker be appointed as delegate to the Conference of Examining Boards which meets in Denver, Colo. Adopted.

It was ordered that the Sec. be required to procure a sufficient quantity of examination papers for next meeting.

It was moved by Dr. Taylor that the rule allowing primary examinations be repealed, and that all candidates be required to stand examinations on all seven of the branches: And that this be published in the N.C. Journal.

Dr. R. S. Neal Jones having made the highest grade 97, was awarded the Appleton prize, a \$25.00 set of books. Dr. Chas. Robinson was awarded second prize given by G. F. Harvey & Co which was a trolley case filled with their manufactured tablets. Dr. Robinson of Chapel Hill was awarded the prize in surgery offered by the Wm. H. Armstrong Co, which was a Gursler

Emergency case with sterilizer

 of Asheville, consisting of one set

The appointment of the Wilmington

The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met in its annual Session in Charlotte on Thursday April 28<sup>th</sup> 1898.

Members present, Drs. J. M. Baker, President, H. B. Weaver, Sec. & Treas., D. T. Taylor, T. A. Anderson <sup>and</sup> H. P. Battle. A quorum being present the President called the Board to order for the transaction of business. The reading of the minutes of last year was temporarily postponed.

The first matter for consideration was the resignation of Dr. R. S. Whithead as a member of the Board which was read by the President. Dr. Taylor moved, and Dr. Weaver seconded the motion that the resignation be accepted. After a long debate and due consideration of the whole question, Dr. J. Howell Hay of Haymesville was unanimously elected to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Whithead. Dr. Hay was notified of his election by telegraph and he accepted and arrived on the 30<sup>th</sup> in readiness to conduct the Examination on Anatomy which Chair was assigned him.

The matter of loss sustained by Dr. H. B. Weaver, Sec. & Treas. in the first Nat. Bank of Asheville, was brought up and after full discussion of the subject, Dr. Weaver was exonerated and relieved from the responsibility of making good the loss, as appears by the following resolution which was adopted by the Board.

Whereas The Board of Medical Examiners of N.C. having heard of the loss of our funds to the amount of \$154,44 through the failure of The First National Bank of Asheville, July, 1897 in which our Sec & Treas had deposited them. The Board, while it deplores the loss of same, yet appreciating the fact that our Sec & Treas, Dr. N.B. Weaver acted in good faith, having entire confidence in the solvency of said Bank, and whereas it appears to the Board that it is a plain case of misplaced confidence in the Bank. Therefore Resolved that the Board holds the said Dr. N. B. Weaver blameless.

Registration began on Thursday afternoon. There were 89 applicants. The examination on Surgery began promptly by Dr. Baker at 9 o'clock Friday morning. Dr. Taylor held his examination Saturday morning on Materia Medica, Dr. Weaver held his examination Saturday evening on Obs. Gyn & Ped. Also, Practical demonstrations on Menstrum. The Board adjourned for Sunday and went to Church.

Monday morning the examinations were continued. Dr. Battle on Chemistry and Dr. Way in the afternoon on Anatomy. Dr. Taylor held examination on Practice for Dr. Baker but the terms of office, 6 years of Drs. Baker & Weaver having expired by limitation of 6 years service, the Society elected Drs. Albert Anderson of Wilson and E. C. Register of

Charlotte in their places. They came forward and were installed in their new offices.

Drs. Battle and Emerson were appointed to audit accounts of Sec. They found it correct and President signed it. The usual honorarium was voted to the retiring Secretary.

The new board was reorganized by the election of Dr. David F. Taylor President and Dr. J. E. Emerson Sec and Treas.

The matter of Dr. Baker being sent as a delegate to Am. Con. Ex. & L. was brought up by Dr. Weaver and after the matter was discussed pro and con, it was determined by the new Board that it was not necessary, wise to send a delegate to Denver meeting this year on account of extreme distance and large expense. The subject of Dr. Parris (of Hudson) character as represented by Dr. Piest in regard to bribery was postponed until Dr. Piest should find out more definitely his status before the law in his country.

Dr. R. W. Myers coming late was granted an oral examination. He having fallen below 35 was rejected. The matter of N. A. Fox in regard to supplying verbatim from Compend on Obstetrics and Gynecology was brought up. He was convicted of so doing beyond any doubt - he was consequently rejected. Mrs. Flow having not read more than 35 on one of the branches was according to the

Law rejected. Dr J N Gray was rejected on account of un-fair means on examination.

Dr Frank Haney on account of illness was granted a license of Temporary license. Notified by Sec. Dr Albert Anderson was assigned to Chair of Obs & Gy. Dr Register to Materia Medica. Dr Burbank at the late hour of the session sent in his resignation as a member of the Board. The new Board accept it. Dr W. S. & H. Cobb of Goldsboro was elected in his place to fill the unexpired term of two years.

The Board having finished all business then adjourned to meet in Asheville in 1899.

Cobb to fill vacancy, this was seconded by Dr Way and Dr Cobb was duly elected. Dr Way, after debate, made motion that the Board do not send delegate to the Confederation of the American Board of Medical Examiners, seconded by Dr Register motion carried. Dr Albert Anderson represented the state of health of Dr R. B. Deane of Wilson to be such as to prevent him from attending the meeting of the Board, that his temporary license be extended. The Board of Medical Examiners <sup>of the State</sup> of N.C. met in the City of Asheville, Rooms of the Battery Park Hotel on Thursday May 25<sup>th</sup> 1899. The members were all present as follows, Dr David T. Taylor, President, Dr Thos E. Anderson, Secretary, Dr J. Howell Hay, E. C. Registrar, K. P. Battle Jr. (N. H. H. Cobb and Albert Anderson. The minutes of the Charlotte Meeting were read and approved. The Pres. appointed Dr Battle and Cobb as committee on finance, who audited Sec- account and found it correct. It was adopted by suggestion of Dr K. P. Battle that the Harvard Blue Books be used in examination, and that aside from these no paper or papers whatever or Book of any kind be allowed on the desks of the applicants, and further that the desks be numbered to correspond to the number of the one occupying it, and that these numbers be changed after each examination.

The Board held its examinations in the Ball Room of the Swan on a Hotel. The applicants were registered on Thursday afternoon and the examinations commenced on Friday morning at 9 o'clock. The first examination was held by Dr J. H. Hay, in Anatomy, Dr D. T. Taylor, held his Examination in Surgery in afternoon at 3 o'clock. At 9 a.m. Saturday, Dr Thos E. Anderson held his Examination in Physiology, Dr Battle in Chemistry at 3 P.M. same day. On Monday 27<sup>th</sup> 9 a.m. Materia Medica by Dr E. C. Registrar, Gyn, Obst + Pediatrics, by Dr Albert Anderson at 3 P.M. By vote of the students, it was carried to hold examination in Practice at night. accordingly, Dr N. H. H. Cobb held his Ex. in Practice at night. The Examinations were terminated Monday night at 11-30.

There were in all 112 applicants, of this number 2 withdrew - the names of these successful appear at the close of these minutes. Dr J. Howell Hay, was prevented by serious sickness of his wife from giving the Board his presence during the

greater part of the Meeting, but fully discharged his duties as Examiner on the Chair of Anatomy to the gratification of the Members of the Board.

The case of Dr. McHair of Edgecomb Co. was brought to the knowledge of the Board by Dr. Julian M. Baker and he, after investigation was granted permission to register. Dr. J. C. Testerman of Ashe Co. was also granted permission to register, he having made oath and filed numerous affidavits that he was practicing in N.C. prior to March 7, 1885.

It was moved and carried that the papers of all rejected candidates should be turned over to the Secretary who should keep them for one year.

It was further moved and carried that the Secy as certain, by writing to all the schools of Medicine in the U.S. the nature and character of the Clinical instruction afforded students in their various schools. The following letter was drafted by Dr. K. P. Battle —

To the Secy or Dean of \_\_\_\_\_ Medical College Dear Sir:  
I am directed by the Board of Med. Ex. of the State of N.C. to respectfully call the attention of your Institution to a new provision in the Medical Law of the State, as amended by the Legislature at its last Session. Sec. Chap. Laws of 1899. reads as follows. The Law becomes effective July 1, 1899.

It is the intention of the Board eventually to deny admission to its examination to the students from Colleges which do not furnish them Clinical instruction, satisfactory to the Board, in character and amount. Stress will be laid upon the student coming in personal contact with the patient. Progress in this direction may be necessarily slow, but it is thought well to acquaint you with the policy, which the Board expects to pursue, and to seek your cooperation.

Note. A dastardly attempt was made at this Meeting to secure a license by fraud. One C. E. Coppedge of Springhope, Nash Co. N.C. employed one Osborne M.D. interne in the Hospital in Baltimore Md. to stand up for him, forging his name &c. Detected and exposed by Secy before accomplishing purpose intended.

The Board met at 8 P. M. members present Dr. Fletcher, Laughinghouse, Porritt, Battle and Presq. Questions were read and approved by the Board as a whole. The registration books showed 129 applicants for license.

The following order of examinations was decided upon: Thursday 9 A. M. Dr. Laughinghouse on Physiology; 3 P. M. Dr. Battle on Materia Medica; 8 P. M. Secy on Chemistry; Friday 9 A. M. Dr. Fletcher on Obstetrics; 3 P. M. Dr. Russell on Surgery; Saturday 9 A. M. Dr. Porritt on Anatomy; 3 P. M. Dr. Kent on Practice - The examination on obstetrics was supplemented by practical work on the menakin and on Anatomy by practical work with the microscope. Dr. Kent arrived at 11 P. M. also Dr. Russell who was detained by an emergency case at home. Four applicants were admitted later making a total of 133. After a careful examination of all the papers it was found that 92 had passed, 40 had failed and one withdrew.

On Monday night the Board met in special session to consider the question of granting permits or license to those claiming to have been practicing in N. C. prior to Mich 7<sup>th</sup>, 1885. 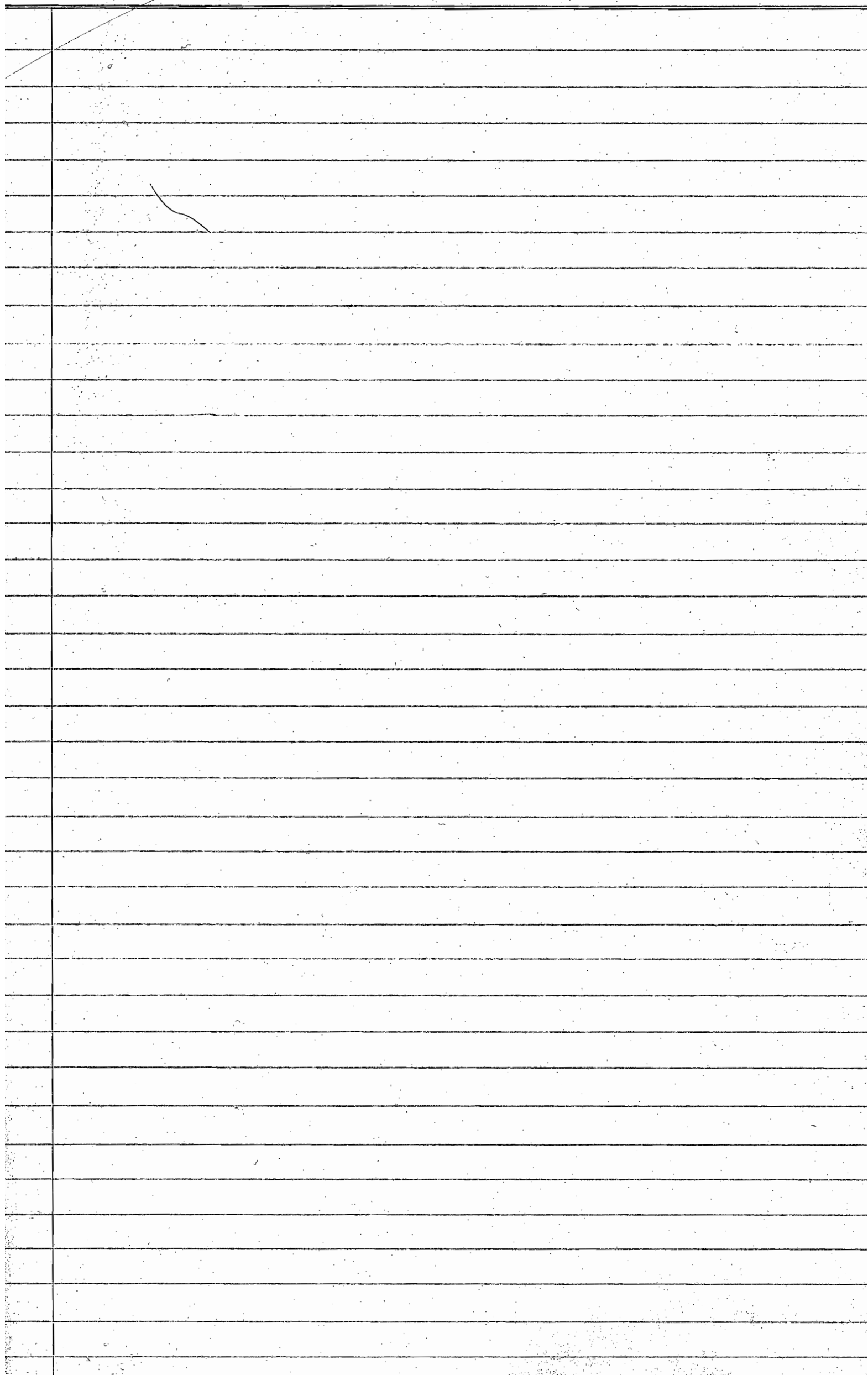
