

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS
OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

Blockade Runner, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina

October 8-10, 1971

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The Board of Medical Examiners of the State of North Carolina met at the Blockade Runner, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina, October 8-10, 1971, for the purpose of interviewing applications for license by endorsement and other business.

Friday, October 8th
6:00 P. M.

The Board convened for dinner. Drs. H. Lee Large, Jr., President, Joseph J. Combs, Secretary-Treasurer, Frank Edmondson, Bryant L. Galusha, Joseph W. Hooper, Jr., Cornelius T. Partrick, Vernon W. Taylor, Jr., Mrs. Louise J. McNeill, Administrative Secretary, and Mrs. Betty Joe Cooke, were present.

RE: Requirements for Credentials - Dr. Joseph J. Combs moved that the secretary be instructed that he is no longer required to get letter of approval of the medical society and letter from the commanding officer with regard to military personnel applying for license by endorsement. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. and passed.

RE: Dr. Thomas D. Hoard, who is in residency training at New Hanover Memorial Hospital, has requested that he be granted license on the basis of Flex examination. He has no state medical license. Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. stated that he had examined him personally for 31 days.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that Dr. Thomas D. Hoard be granted license on the basis of the Flex examination when he completes requirements and makes a personal appearance before the Board. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. and passed unanimously. (See P. 157 these Minutes)

RE: Dr. Bennie Brooks Ward - Application for BNDD Number - Dr. Ward has applied for all schedules, narcotic and non-narcotic.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that Dr. Bennie Brooks ward be approved for BNDD number, Number 2 non-narcotic, in addition to 3, 4 and 5. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed unanimously. Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. abstained from voting.

RE: Biennial Registration - Reinstatement - The licenses to practice medicine of the following physicians were suspended for failure to register as required by the General Statute of North Carolina 90-15.00 and they have now registered:

RESOLVED:: That the medical licenses of the abobe listed physicians be reinstated.

RE: Fire Insurance - The secretary reported to the Board that \$5,000.00 fire insurance is carried.

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the amount of fire insurance be doubled. This motion was seconded and passed.

RE: August, 1972 Meeting - Dr. Galusha moved that the Board hold this meeting August 3-6th, 1971, at the Grove Park Inn, Asheville. Dr. Edmondson seconded the same and it was passed unanimously.

RE: Fall Meeting - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the Board meet at the Blockade Runner, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina September 29-October 1st, 1971. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick and passed.

RE: Foreign Medical Graduates - Flex Examination - Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that graduates of foreign medical schools applying for license by examination be required to take the examination in Raleigh under the supervision of the Board of Medical Examiners. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. and passed unanimously.

RE: Conversion to Full License - The following physicians are applying for conversion from limited to full license:

 Dr. David Rafat - Naturalized
 Name changed by court order to "Raft"

VERDICT: Dr. Joseph W. Hooper, Jr. moved that the licenses of the above physicians be converted to full license and that Dr. David Rafat's name be changed to "Raft" as per court order. This motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned.

Saturday, October 9 - 9 A. M.

The following physicians were interviewed for license by endorsement of credentials:

RE: Dr. Ronald Bernard Addlestone appeared applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is a resident in Radiology at Duke University School of Medicine.

Dr. Large: Have you had any difficulty with a medical examining board? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever used barbiturates, other habit forming drugs or alcohol to excess? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever used narcotics? A. No sir

VERDICT: Dr. Ronald Bernard Addlestone was approved for license by endorsement of credentials.

Dr. Large: Where will you work?
 A. Onslow and probably Wilmington.

Q. Have you had any difficulty with a medical examining board? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever used barbiturates, other habit forming drugs or alcohol to excess? A. No sir
 Q. Have you used narcotics personally? A. No sir

VERDICT: Dr. Watson Caufield Arnold, Jr. was approved for license by endorsement of credentials, if and when his credentials are completed satisfactory to the secretary.

RE: Dr. Oswald Berrios is a native of Puerto Rico and a graduate of the University of Maryland in 1952. He was licensed in Maryland by examination and in Pennsylvania, Louisiana and Puerto Rico.

Dr. Large: We would like to have a letter from someone who has known you in Baltimore.

Q. Have you had any difficulty with a medical examining board?
 A. I started practicing in Baltimore instead of going to Puerto Rico. At that time I practiced in private practice. In 1961 some of the doctors perhaps felt that I was infringing their area being from outside and charges were brought as far as an error made in interpretation of an x-ray. A lady got hurt, slammed the door and she was unable to extend the arm. At that time I had a group, seven to eight persons, surgeon, internist, obstetrician-gynecologist, dentist. I took the x-ray in the position it was. She could



not extend it. In this position it usually shows head of the radius - - -. At that time it did look like there was a fissure fracture, together with clinical evidence, swelling. I did interpret it as a fracture. About 19 days after they had taken another x-ray in another office with extended arm. At that time they felt there was no fracture. For that reason they felt I had tried to state there was a fracture when there was no fracture. Following that the orthopedist said fissure fractures not unusual to occur and that position being extended is the only way it can show. As a result the Board of Medical Examiners felt even with that my license should be revoked. This decision was stayed after proper hearing. Even if I had made a mistake it was not so big a case for that severe punishment. The verdict was put aside. Thus I have never been without a license and have practiced since 1952. Since then I have had all my reciprocities following this incident. Louisiana, Puerto Rico and Pennsylvania gave me reciprocity and I was certified by the American College last year.

Dr. Large: There were other charges, do you remember what they were?

A. The others in general were I did not take good care, proper care of some of the patients. There again all the patients came in and said if there was anybody did care it was I. There was a third case. I have always felt patients - - -; I was having office hours, somebody was there 24 hours, either I or my assistant. I used to get a lot of traumatic cases.

Q. You were charged with charging too much.

A. This patient came in, no insurance, called me, who treated the same. On the way out said she did try to pay some money toward the bill even though I understated the amount. A week or two after she brings the paper in for some kind of insurance. Then I said I charged the same as if no insurance. My secretary filled the paper and sent them out. Then she said there was a difference in what she would have paid and the insurance. It was interpreted because she had insurance I ordered to increase the bill proportionately. It was not true. You have to treat patients just the same as they have the money. If they have insurance they should pay the usual fee as anyone else.

Q. A complaint was lodged by the Child Accident Plan for charges to children.

A. It was a matter, I felt you should charge - - -; There are some things at that time, laceration, many of them you have to depend on the degree of severity, time you spend with the patient. They feel regardless of the time spent, it is a small time, charge lowly. It was based more on what the patient had.

Q. The fees paid by the Union Welfare Fund, did you receive your full charge?

A. Yes sir

Q. With respect to fees for two children under Blue Shield Accident plan, did you receive full charge?

A. Yes sir

Q. With respect to fees for two children under Blue Shield Accident plan, did you receive full charge?

A. Yes sir

Dr. Galusha: Where have you practiced, initially in Maryland immediately after graduation from the University of Maryland?

A. No sir, I had a year of internship and one year of Internal Medicine. After that I went to practice.

Q. How long were you in Baltimore?

A. Approximately 9 years

Q. Then where?

A. One and a half years industrial medicine in Puerto Rico. I went to New Orleans. I got reciprocity there.

Q. How long did you practice in New Orleans?

A. I took training.



Dr. Berrios continued

Dr. Galusha: Anesthesia?

A. I took 6 months first in Radiology, then I took 3 years Anesthesiology training under Dr. Adriani. I taught at Tulane my third year, then Louisiana State fourth year medical school training at Tulane. Then I went to Pittsburgh at the University School of Medicine. There are 5 hospitals there. I was stationed at the Eye and Ear Hospital, consultant at Presbyterian Hospital with Dr. Peter Safar. From there I went chief of Anesthesiology to Franklin Hospital, two hours from Pittsburgh where I started Inhalation Therapy and Pulmonary Function Lab. I am planning to go to Forsyth Memorial Hospital in Inhalation Therapy and Pulmonary Function.

Dr. Combs: What position have they offered you?

A. Assistant Chief of Anesthesiology and director of Pulmonary Function and Inhalation Service.

Dr. Galusha: Do these men know you well?

A. He has known me, Dr. Safar. I did not work so much with him.

Q. You are leaving there because you have a better opportunity?

A. I am leaving because of the cold weather, snow almost every day, second I want to do more Inhalation Therapy per se.

Dr. Large: On your original application there is the question of statement in which you say " I have never been charged with violation of any Federal, State or Local Statute except as follows: None"

A. I did not write that. This was made by the Board of Medical Examiners. I ^{was} told by them because there had been no charge proved in the past legally. I have never had a license revoked. This is what I was told.

Q. Who told you that?

A. This goes back --you have letter from the attorney general that states because of the stay I have never been without a license.

Q. What individual told you to write "none"?

A. I did not write it.

Q. You filled out the blank?

A. I filled out everything but that. This was taken there blank purposely- - -.

Q. You filled out the rest of this and left that blank?

A. Yes

Q. How about the question - Has any medical board revoked or suspended certificate issued to you?

A. At the top and also at the end left blank.

Q. Was this done by two different typewriters?

A. I do not know, they filled it out. Before they said something about being revoked, before that said except. This time they did not say that.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that the Board withhold and not grant license at this time, but pursue further inquiry: 1. By asking the Maryland Board of Medical Examiners whether in fact they did fill out the answers and 2. That he furnish letters from Drs. Safar and Adriani, to send letters of recommendation. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Bryant L. Galusha and passed.

Dr. Large: The Board wants to get this absolutely clear with respect to line 4. Did you fill in this word, type this word?

A. My wife typed it.

Q. Did she type this in?

A. I can only tell you what I told here, this looks very familiar, don't you think.

Q. She typed this?

A. I did say it looks very familiar to me. I tell her very definitely number 4 to be left out. I did sign the thing. This looks familiar to me.



Dr. Berrios continued

Dr. Large: The Board wishes to make inquiries about your previous training so we will have to let action lay until the next meeting if we can get additional information. This will constitute your appearance and if we need you to come back, we will give you adequate notice.

- Q. Have you ever been convicted of a crime? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever used barbiturates, other habit forming drugs or alcohol to excess? A. Yes sir, socially.
 Q. Has it ever interfered with your working as a doctor? A. No sir
 Q. Have you ever used narcotics personally? A. No sir, definitely.

Dr. Edmondson: When do you contemplate coming to Forsyth?

A. I am planning to come immediately. I thought, I have never had any problem with other reciprocities. I had already made plans.

Q. Have you moved?

A. No sir, I came myself. I am staying with Dr. Monroe, obstetrician, but have not moved my family.

Dr. Galusha: Are you working at Forsyth?

A. No sir, they told me not to work until they heard from you. I have been going around. The service has been behind because they could not get a respiratory director.

Dr. Combs: How long have you been in Winston-Salem?

A. A week, I have not done any medicine, just working at the service. Is it possible for this Board to allow me just Inhalation Therapy as much as they need it there and the time it takes. Could I be allowed pending that you receive this information you want, not in Anesthesiology but Inhalation Service? We are trying to bring it up to standard of the University of - - -. Could I be allowed until your next meeting?

Dr. Large: Anything you do in the way of prescribing, treating or diagnosing patients is within the framework of the Medical Practice Act and by de-the practice of medicine. If you worked in Inhalation Therapy, if you are not going to practice medicine, it would have to be limited to Inhalation Therapy technician. You could not exercise any judgment.

Dr. Galusha: There is nothing to prevent you from being a technician in Anesthesiology, but this is under the direct direction of a physician.

You are cognizant what a lay - - -can do. Their duties are broad. In most hospitals the chiefs of Inhalation Therapy are not doctors.

A. That is right. Then I can do that?

Dr. Galusha: The Board does not have any authority over that.

Dr. Large: That is right, our authority is with doctors and - - -and practice, you have broken laws feloniously.

A. In Anesthesia, when we used to have nurse anesthetists, they would - - - under the chief of service.

Q. Are you a nurse?

A. What I am trying to bring out is this - - -. I did not expect this. I have three kinds, one in college, to be two months without doing anything is very traumatic.

Dr. Partrick: Would it help you if we were to write the chief of the respective services in which you expect to work and explain the situation, that you do not have a license and with that limitation they could employ your talents as a technician? Would that help?

A. That would be very nice to make it official.

Q. Other than practice of medicine, this Board has no power of regulation. That would help.

Dr. Large: In anesthesia I think you would find it hard not to overstep your bounds.



RE: Dr. Lewis Lincoln Bock appeared with incomplete credentials applying for license by endorsement of credentials. He is director of the Health Department of Burke County.

Dr. Large: Have you been doing Public Health all the time?

A. No, I was in the School of Public Health at the University of Minnesota and received my masters. I was 14 years in Pediatrics, four years in Colorado, 10 in Montana.

Dr. William Alton Moody, Broughton Hospital, Morganton, North Carolina - (See previous Minutes) Dr. Moody appeared and advised that he is now working at Broughton Hospital and involved with the Mental Health Clinics of five counties; that his condition is satisfactory and that he is not taking any medication. He said that he had told the superintendent he would stay there for a year, but was not sure he would want to stay in institutional work. Dr. Moody was advised that the Board was pleased with his progress and that it was hoped he would not entertain the idea of going back into private practice too soon.

The Board directed that Dr. Moody be seen in March, 1972.

RE: Dr. Joseph Claude Fesperman, Stanley, North Carolina- (See previous Minutes) - Due to illness Dr. Fesperman was unable to appear before the Board in August, 1971, as directed and because of this the Board instructed him to abstain from practice until his appearance at this time. Dr. Fesperman appeared and stated that he stayed in the hospital for three weeks with abscesses on his legs. He said he had taken some talwin by mouth and by injection for pain in his legs before going to

the hospital. He also said that he is on some medication prescribed by his doctors, but denied being on any other type of medication. He is working at the Crippled Children's Hospital, O'Berry Center, and stated that he is doing well; that he is getting no therapy. To be seen in March, 1972.

Dr. Frank Edmondson nominated Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick for president for the coming year. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Written Examination - Part II - Dr. Hooper moved that the 69 who have credit for Part I and have not completed Part II be advised by letter that the examination will be given one more time in 1972, notify five years back. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed unanimously.

RE: Assistant to Physicians - Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the institution application form as presented to the Board and now used by the Duke and Wake Forest group be approved for the official application for certification of the program. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. V. W. Taylor, Jr. and passed.

Dr. Frank Edmondson moved that the application for approval for an assistant to a physician be adopted with suggested changes. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

Dr. Cornelius T. motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed unanimously.

Dr. Vernon W. Taylor, Jr. reviewed the Wake Forest University program and moved that the Wake Forest University program be approved, provided that it shall confirm to the uniform and minimum standard that will be forthcoming by the American Medical Association Council on Medical Education. This motion was duly seconded by Dr. Joseph J. Combs and passed.

Dr. Galusha moved that the initial registration fee be \$50.00 and annual registration fee \$10.00. This motion was duly seconded and by Dr. Frank Edmondson and passed.

RE: Dr. Donald R. Bailey, Charleston, West Virginia (See previous Minutes) Dr. Bailey appeared before the Board of Medical Examiners in June, 1971 applying for license by endorsement of credentials and due to certain information at hand the Board directed further investigation. At the August, 1971 meeting the Board directed that Dr. Bailey be asked to make another appearance before the Board. On October 1st Dr. Bailey advised the secretary that there had been such delay in receiving license that he was withdrawing his application and asked for refund of fee. The secretary refunded Dr. Bailey, less 10% as per the policy of the Board.

RE: Dr. V. Clifton Lanier, Welcome, North Carolina - The State Bureau of Investigation has reported that in the course of an investigation with regard to a trial, discrepancies in refills of stimulant drugs for the defendants were found, which involved Dr. Lanier.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that Dr. V. Clifton Lanier be interviewed at the December, 1971 meeting. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. Albert Kodack, Asheville, North Carolina - Dr. Kodack reported that his patient who is on narcotics is attempting to provide for care of a school age son in order to enter Broughton Hospital for treatment, but this has not to date been accomplished.

VERDICT: This report was received as information. The Board directed that report be requested of Dr. Kodack for the December, 1971 meeting.

RE: Dr. Grady C. Siske, Pleasant Garden, North Carolina - Report of investigation was received from the Bureau of Narcotics in September, 1971 on Dr. Siske. It was stated that his narcotics and DACA drugs were seized in February, 1971, at which time Dr. Siske surrendered his narcotic tax stamp and stated that he planned to retire from medical practice. However, he decided to continue practice, operating a weight clinic. The report stated that discrepancies were found in Dr. Siske's records on amphetamines; that had kept no record on narcotics dispensed.

VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that Dr. Grady Siske be seen at the December, 1971 meeting. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Dr. James Spullock Lambert, Swannanoa, North Carolina - The secretary presented report dated September 29th, 1971, from the Pharmacy Board that no improper prescriptions issued by Dr. Lambert had been found in the area of Swannanoa when inspection was made in July, 1971. This was received as information.

RE: Dr. Jack Foster, Eden, North Carolina - The secretary presented report of the State Bureau of Investigation, which was precipitated by the Chief of Police of Eden. It was alleged that numerous prescriptions for narcotic drugs had been written by Dr. Foster; that several of the prescriptions had been picked up by Dr. Foster after writing the prescriptions in the store and paying for the same; that in some instances patients had not received the drugs; that some persons whose names were on the prescriptions had never been treated by Dr. Foster; that some of the persons listed on the prescriptions did not exist.

Dr. Foster continued

Dr. Foster appeared with his attorney, Mr. Monroe M. Redden of Hendersonville. Dr. Foster stated that while practicing in Hendersonville he would write some prescriptions for his mother and pick up the drugs to take to her. He also stated he had picked up some prescriptions for a terminal cancer patient on whom he was making a house call and to the best of his knowledge everyone for whom he had written prescriptions had received the drugs.

Dr. Foster's attorney, after conferring with his client, stated that Dr. Foster would withdraw his application for BNDD number and not apply for Schedule II narcotics. The Board did not resume deliberations on the testimony awaiting the outcome of Dr. Foster's offer not to apply for the privilege of writing for hard narcotics.

The Board delegated Dr. Frank Edmondson to discuss the matter of Dr. Foster with the councillor for the State Medical Society for further investigation.

RE: Dr. John Bumgarner, Newton, North Carolina - (See previous Minutes) The secretary advised that he had requested report from Dr. Bumgarner for this meeting but had received no reply from him.

VERDICT: Dr. Cornelius T. Partrick moved that he be requested to appear at the December, 1971 meeting. This motion was duly seconded and passed.

RE: Finance Committee - The incoming president appointed the following to the Finance Committee: Dr. H. Lee Large, Chairman, and Drs. Frank Edmondson and Vernon W. Taylor, Jr.

RE: Proposed Budget was presented to the Board. The president requested that \$4,400 interest be added for income.


VERDICT: Dr. Bryant L. Galusha moved that the proposed budget be adopted. The expected interest from the savings accounts is to be included in the proposed income.
