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**TEMPORARY RULE 21 NCAC 32B .2100**

Consideration of final approval of proposed temporary rule 21 NCAC 32B .2100 Interstate Medical Licensure Compact.

In order to implement the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact that goes into effect January 1, 2026 per SL 2025-37, a Special Meeting, via MS Teams, of the Board is being convened to consider public comments, if any, regarding the proposed temporary rule before determining final approval.

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\*Disciplinary hearings are open to the public; however, certain portions may be closed to prevent the disclosure of information that is non-public pursuant to Sections 90-8, 90-14, 90-16, or 90-21 and 90-22 of the North Carolina General Statutes and not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.

**\*\*Notes on Closed Session**

- (1) Closed portions are to investigate, examine, or determine the character and other qualifications of applicants for professional licenses or certificates while meeting with respect to individual applicants for such licenses or certificates.
- (2) Closed portions are to prevent the disclosure of information that is confidential pursuant to Sections 90-8, 90-14, 90-16, or 90-21 and 90-22 of the North Carolina General Statutes and not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.
- (3) Closed portions are to consult with the Board's attorney in order to preserve the attorney-client privilege between the attorney and the Board.
- (4) Closed portions are to take disciplinary action against persons holding licenses or certificates while meeting with respect to individual holders of such licenses or certificates.
- (5) Closed portions are to consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee.

1 21 NCAC 32B .2100 is proposed for adoption under temporary procedures as follows:

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7 21 NCAC 32B .2100 INTERSTATE MEDICAL LICENSURE COMPACT

8 (a) Any applicant applying for a North Carolina medical license through the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact  
9 (“Compact”) shall pay a non-refundable application fee pursuant to G.S. 90-13.1(a).

10 (b) Any applicant seeking licensure through the Compact with North Carolina as a state of principal license shall pay  
11 to the Board the cost of a criminal background check.

12 (c) Any holder of a North Carolina medical license obtained through the Compact shall annually register his or her  
13 license through the Compact and pay the annual registration fee no later than 30 days after his or her birthday pursuant  
14 to G.S. 90-13.2. The Board will provide a notice of renewal as required by Compact rules. After submitting their  
15 registration to the Compact, holders of a Compact license shall submit additional information the Board is required to  
16 collect pursuant to any law, including but not limited to, G.S. 90-5.2 and G.S. 143-789, and any corresponding rule,  
17 within 30 days of submitting their renewal to the Compact. The license of any physician who fails to register and who  
18 remains unregistered for a period of 30 days after certified notice of the failure is automatically inactive pursuant to  
19 G.S. 90-13.2(e).

20 (d) Applicants granted a North Carolina medical license through the Compact must submit information the Board is  
21 required to collect pursuant to any law, including but not limited to G.S. 90-5.2 and G.S. 143-789, and any  
22 corresponding rule, within 30 days of being granted a Compact license. Failure to submit the information within 30  
23 days may result in disciplinary action under G.S. 90-14(a)(17).
