2 21 NCAC 32R .0101 CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION (CME) REQUIRED

- 3 (a) Continuing Medical Education (CME) is defined as education, training, and activities to increase knowledge and
- 4 skills generally recognized and accepted by the profession as within the basic medical sciences, the discipline of
- 5 clinical medicine, and the provision of healthcare to the public. The purpose of CME is to maintain, develop, or
- 6 improve the physician's knowledge, skills, professional performance, and relationships that a physicians use physician
- 7 <u>uses</u> to provide services for their patients, <u>patients</u> their <u>and</u> practice, the public, or the profession.
- 8 (b) Each person A physician licensed to practice medicine in the State of North Carolina, except those physicians
- 9 holding a residency training license, shall complete at least 60 hours of Category 1 CME relevant to the physician's
- current or intended specialty or area of practice every three years. Beginning on July 1, 2017, every-Every physician
- 11 who prescribes controlled substances, except those physicians holding a residency training license, shall complete at
- least three 3 hours of CME, CME from the required 60 hours of Category 1 CME, that is CME designed specifically
- 13 to address controlled substance prescribing practices. The controlled substance prescribing CME shall include
- 14 instruction on controlled substance prescribing practices, recognizing signs of the abuse or misuse of controlled
- substances, practices and controlled substance prescribing for chronic pain management. CME that includes
- 16 recognizing signs of the abuse or misuse of controlled substances, or non-opioid treatment options shall qualify for
- 17 <u>the purposes of this rule.</u>
- 18 (c) The three year three-year period described in Paragraph (b) of this Rule begins on the physician's first-birthday
- following the initial licensure issuance of his or her license.
